A wonderfully fruity and seriously smoky single malt, produced in very small batches, this Speyside whisky that's big on flavour.

Located on the outskirts of the ancient Royal Borough of Forres lies Benromach - Speyside's smallest working distillery

Built in 1898, the year of the great distillery boom. Alexander Edward of Sanquhar, a well-known promoter of new distilleries, granted a feu charter to the Benromach Distillery Company for a plot of his land, north of the railway line in Forres.

The distillery was designed by the famous Elgin Architect, Charles Doig. Closed and dismantled in 1983 along with a number of other distilleries. In 1993 the site was purchased by Gordon & MacPhail and several years later work commenced on re-equipping the distillery.

Benromach was officially re-opened by HRH The Prince of Wales in 1998.

Just two experienced distillers create Benromach using the finest Scottish barley and the purest spring water from the nearby Romach Hills. They personally ensure that only the highest quality spirit is filled into sturdy oak casks before being left to mature at Benromach Distillery for many years.

Only produced in very small batches of this unique Benromach Speyside whisky, The finest Scottish barley is malted with high levels of peat smoke at 67ppm (parts per million: the phenol level, to those in the know)

Taste with water

NOSE: The delicate smokiness complements lemon, honey and vanilla aromas with sweet hints of apricot and sugared almonds developing on the tongue.

PALATE: Slow cooked apple, pear and tangy grapefruit give way to a trace of cocoa powder and an absolutely gorgeous edge of lingering cigars.

BODY: Medium

FINISH: A fruity and smoky single malt whisky.
